The group have been heading to Heathmont Mini Golf on alternating weeks. They have been loving the different themed putting ranges. Everyone always enjoys this program and loves heading there.






ARTS AND CRAFT














Next Step Pakenham

Barista Course

Participants from Next Step Ringwood completed a Barista course at Coonara Community House in Upper Ferntree Gully, a provider of accredited training providing opportunities to all. The group learnt how to use a commercial coffee machine to make all types of coffee and gain the skills to work in hospitality. Each participant received an acredited certificate of completion after the conclusion of the course.


